General Samuel Chapman Armstrong 1839-1893

GENERAL SAMUEL CHAPMAN ARMSTRONG FOUNDER HAMPTON UNIVERSITY

In 1866, Brigadier General Samuel Chapman Armstrong was appointed Superintendent of the Freeman's Bureau of the Ninth District of Virginia. Drawing upon his personal experiences as the son of missionaries in Hawaii, he secured funds from the American Missionary Association to establish a school on the Wood Farm, also referred to as "Little Scotland." On April 1, 1868, General Armstrong opened Hampton Normal and Agricultural Institute.

With energy and eloquence, he traveled across the country, raising money, recruiting teachers, and hiring experienced architects to assist in his mission to construct impressive buildings on the campus. Ten years later, he expanded his mission and opened the Institute's doors to Native American students which inspired the establishment of Native American schools throughout the nation.

General Armstrong died on May 11, 1893, but not before seeing his mission complete. Hampton Institute, because of his leadership and vision, would send thousands of teachers out to educate and lead the people.

GENERAL XAVIER T. BRUNSON

Commander UNC/CFC/USFK



General Xavier T. Brunson is the Commander of United Nations Command, Combined Forces Command, and United States Forces Korea, at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea.

As a General Officer, General Brunson has served in numerous staff and command positions in Conventional and Special Operations Forces.

His operational assignments have included service in Operations IRAQI FREEDOM, ENDURING FREEDOM, FREEDOM'S SENTINEL, and INHERENT RESOLVE.

General Brunson was commissioned as an Infantry Officer upon graduation from Hampton University with a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science. He also earned a Master of Arts in Human Resource Development from Webster University and a Master of Science in National Security Strategic Studies from the United States Army War College.

General Brunson's notable civic awards include Omega Psi Phi's Brother Dr. Julian Haywood Gamma Epsilon Founder's Leadership Award and the United States National Park Service's Trailblazer Award from the Charles Young Buffalo Soldiers National Monument. The following honors were awarded by U.S. Army Regimental Associations: Honorable Order of Saint Barbara (Field Artillery), Honorable Order of Saint Michael (Aviation), Centurion Order of Saint Maurice (Infantry), Order of Aaron and Hur (Chaplains), Thomas Knowlton Award (Military Intelligence), and Colonel Eli E. Nobleman Award (Civil Affairs).

General Brunson is married to Colonel (retired) Kirsten Brunson and they have two daughters and one son.
