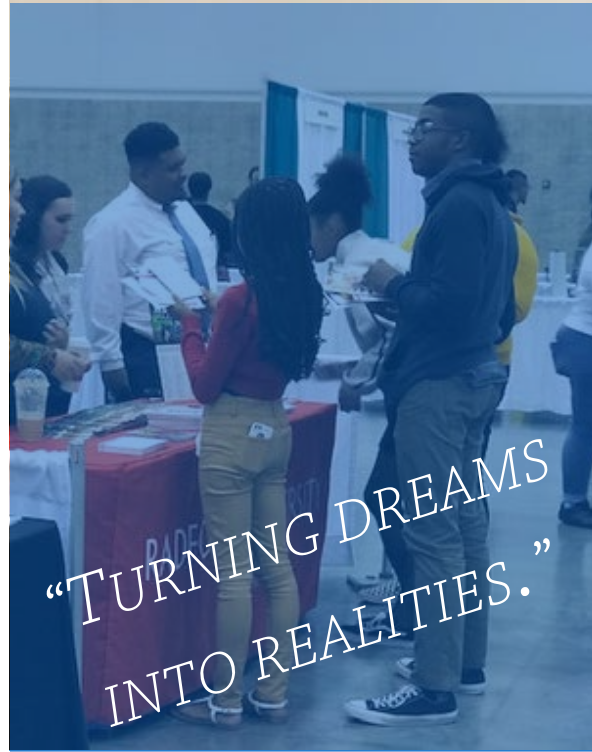




WHAT SERVICES DOES UPWARD BOUND PROVIDE?

WHAT IS UPWARD BOUND?

Upward Bound is one of seven federal TRIO programs funded by the Department of Education to increase college access among income eligible and potential first-generation college students. The purpose of the UB Program at four year institutions specifically, as stated by the U. S. Department of Education, is to generate in target area program participants the skills and motivation necessary to complete a program of secondary education and to subsequently enter and earn a postsecondary degree.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO JOIN UPWARD BOUND?

Students attending the schools listed above must meet one or more of the following components to be considered for the Upward Bound program:

- *Potential First-Generation College Student of their Family*
- *Income Eligibility and/or*
- *Individual who has a high risk of academic failure, and has a need for academic support in order to successfully pursue a 4-year college degree.*



HOW WILL PARTICIPANTS BE SELECTED FOR UPWARD BOUND?

Selected participants must have a goal of entering postsecondary education and demonstrate a need for project services. All new participants will be placed on a 9-week probationary period to gauge attendance and participation.
